

Derek Morter, who has lived in France for many years, died on 28th September 2022. Born in Norwich, Derek was a Tiger from January 1952 to October 1954, and as a Pilot then Flying Officer with the squadron he flew the Meteor FMk8. During his time with 74 he served under an American CO, Lt Col Milholland USAF. Also on the squadron when Derek was there was US Marine Captain Hal Berge on exchange as well as Australian Flying Officer Griff Boord. Derek retired with a total of 9,000 hours in his log books. 6,500 of these were on Hunters (1,000 hours with the RAF and 5,500 hours with the FRADU.) It was after FRADU that the Morter family retired to France.
